FABRIC SALE July 17, 18, 19!

Holy Smokes ladies!! We've had an amazing response to our fabric sale preparations. We had a large group show up to move fabric. Everything was loaded into the trailer in 1 hour (teamwork!!) and it took about 30 minutes to unload at the climate-controlled storage in Morris. We have about 5 large totes remaining that need to be sized and tagged-over 140 bins have been taken to be measured and marked, and many have been finished and returned!

UPDATE ON DATES: Our sale is July 17, 18, 19 (9am-4pm) with set up July 16 at the Channahon UMC. We need lots of help with setup and on the sale days. We have some sitdown jobs, as well as needing fabric cutters and people to help our customers. We will have sign-up sheets at the May meeting and will share specifics **then.** The committee is working hard to come up with the best plan to make this sale go very smoothly.

Help us spread the word by sharing the flyer (attached) on your social media or with friends, family, and other groups that you're in that might be interested. We will be sharing the flyer with other guilds, but go ahead and share them if you're a member elsewhere, just in case we don't get it to the correct person. Also, if you can think of places to put up the flyer, please let us know. (Quilt shops probably aren't going to want to help with publicity.)

If you don't want to measure alone, invite friends over to help. If you would like, we could meet at the storage location, set up a table, and work right there. For measuring, there are instructions and tags in the storage unit, so if you need those in addition to a container or two to measure, please be sure to request papers!

Program updates for our June thread-painting workshop:

I hope everyone is excited to try out some thread painting during our June workshop on **Saturday**, **June 14th** with Judy Bender!! **Remember our June meeting will be Friday**, **June 13th**! It will be a great skill to enhance wall hangings and table runners.

Update about machine feet from Judy Bender: "I like the open toe foot for free motion straight stitch and the variable zigzag foot for the zigzag free motion quilting technique. You can use either one, but some machines force you to use a specific foot for free motion quilting under the machine settings. I will be demonstrating both. They have different

purposes and the results are different, so I just tell people to use what they are comfortable with to start. If they can bring their machine accessories and manual, we can troubleshoot just about anything. ... My presentation on Friday will cover this so everyone can attend prepared at the workshop."

Do you have a Pieces from the Heart Name Tag?

Attached to the newsletter is the PDF of the foundation paper piecing for your guild nametag.

I also have light pink printed copies of this available at each meeting.

Here's the text on the back:

Because our guild is named "Pieces from the Heart", our founders decided that we should have a pieced heart name tag. We ask that you follow these simple instructions and adhere to only a few rules. The background should be a cream solid or cream-on-cream or other light fabric that will allow your name to be clearly visible. The heart should be made from three fabrics that blend together well. Your name tag can be embellished in any way you would like, but should remain fairly simple. Your name should go above the heart and should be in readable (simple) block lettering. Use the pattern provided so that our name tags can be consistent.

Starting with the background, cut two squares the size of the pattern and one same-size batting square.

Then using the other block pattern (A, B, C), cut out each piece adding ¼" around each. Sew A to B; then sew C to AB.

Cut out and appliqué the heart to the name tag, following the appliqué method of your choice: machine applique, freezer-paper applique, and fusible applique (fuse before cutting).

Appliqué can be done through all the layers if desired but you may want to do the name only on the top layer.

With all the layers in place and all lettering completed, binding can now be added. You can hand-stitch a safety pin to the back to make it easy to wear.

Wear your name tag to each meeting so that we can all get to know each other.
